Imperialism Research Poster Project [45pts]

General Description:

- Based on what we've learned about Imperialism thus far, you will be working in groups to research a country that was imperialized and taken over during the <u>Age of Imperialism</u>
- Complete the "Research Guide" worksheet to gain information about your country
- Once the research is completed, you will use the information to create a poster that is <u>appealing</u>, <u>exemplifies good work</u>, and <u>provides information</u> to others about your country during this age

Basic Directions:

- 1. Research
 - a. You are expected to be <u>actively researching</u> and not spending time off task. You should be doing research outside of class as well
 - b. Use the research guide and answer each question clearly
 - c. If you choose to not use your time wisely in class, you may be asked to complete the project independently

2. Sourcing:

- a. Sources must be cited in the <u>works cited page</u>
- b. You are required to have at least five separate sources of information
- c. Your textbook can be a resource (if it provides useful information)
- d. Sources NOT allowed:
 - i. <u>Wikipedia, Answers.com, Yahoo Answers, Quora, Baidu,</u> <u>Ask.com</u>
- e. The Works Cited Page will be attached to **the back of your poster**, and will be evaluated after the completion of the presentation

3. <u>Poster</u>:

- a. Your group will create a poster that <u>displays all your research</u> on it
- b. You must configure the essential elements of your research on the poster, but you <u>MAY NOT simply paste the research guide</u> onto your poster
- c. The information on your poster <u>must be legible and clearly visible</u>. I recommend typing, printing it out, then placing it on the poster
- d. The poster MUST INCLUDE one hand-drawn map
 - i. The map <u>must be original</u> and **not** simply printed out
 - 1. Can be traced, but with original information
 - ii. The map should provide related information

Rubric:

- □ <u>Poster [32]</u>
 - *Map*[7] Must have at least ONE hand-drawn map. It needs to be informational, colorful, and appealing
 - *Pictures*[7] Pictures used must be related to your country and topic.
 Each picture should include a small 1-2 sentence caption explaining it
 - *Quality*[4] Poster should be colorful, appealing, neat, and creative
 - Sources[7] Your group should have at least 5 difference sources of information on your works cited page that will be turned in
 - Information[7] Poster should include information gathered from the guide and presented in an effective and stimulating way
- □ Research Guide [13]
 - *Research Guide* Each group member must submit a completed research guide with all questions completely answered

Research Guide

Directions: You should be using this research guide to find information on your assigned country. All the questions below should be answered **in complete sentences** <u>on a separate piece</u> <u>of paper</u>. The information can and should be used on your poster or visual aid. **The research**

guide must be turned in when you turn in your poster

*<u>Remember</u> – **EACH group member** needs to submit a completed research guide. Do your own research so that you can compare research when working on the poster.

1. Colonial Parent Country

- a. <u>Who</u> was your country's colonial power? Who took them over?
- b. <u>When</u> did they take over?
- c. <u>Why</u> did they take over? What did your country have that was worth taking over?
- d. <u>How</u> did your parent country take over your country? Provide detailed information
- e. How was your country treated under its colonial power? Provide <u>real life</u> <u>examples</u>. Simply saying "good" or "bad" is NOT acceptable and will result in <u>0</u> <u>points</u>

2. Independence

- a. <u>When</u> did your country gain independence?
- b. <u>Who was involved</u> in the process of independence? (Countries, people, etc.)
- c. How did your country gain <u>independence</u>? Be detailed here in explaining the step as to how your country became independent from their colonial power

3. Lasting Impact/Effects of Imperialism

- a. What were the <u>effects</u> of imperialism on your country? (5-6 effects should be listed)
- b. What is your country currently like when looking at it in **2019**?

4. Citations

- a. List all sources from where you gained your information
 - iii. Again, no sources from <u>Wikipedia</u>, <u>Answers.com</u>, <u>Yahoo Answers</u>, <u>Quora</u>, <u>Baidu</u>, <u>Ask.com</u>
