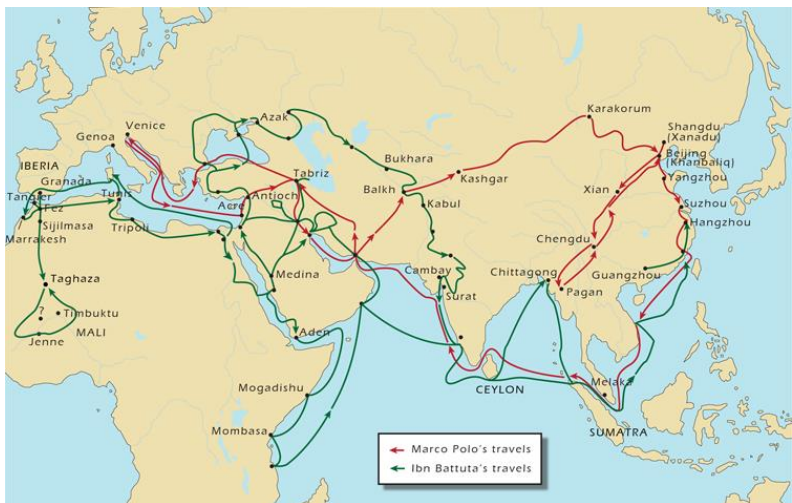

The Travels of Ibn Battuta Pt. 2



Ibn Battuta was a 14th century Muslim traveler who made his way across Africa, Asia, and Europe on his pilgrimage to Mecca. In total, his journey lasted 29 years, spanning 44 countries, and 75,000 miles (120,000kms). In his book, the *Rihla*, he wrote about his journey and the many adventures he had including disasters, dangers, oddities, and love.

Task 1 – Ibn Battuta’s Travels (My Part # _____)
