Treaty of Versailles

Look over the following abridged version of the Treaty of Versailles. Use it to construct answers for the questions below.

Article number	Description
1-26:	The Covenant of the League of Nations - Germany was not allowed to join.
42:	The Rhineland was demilitarised - the German army was not allowed to go there.
45:	The Saar, with its rich coalfields, given to France for 15 years.
51:	Alsace-Lorraine returned to France.
80:	Germany forbidden to unite with Austria.
87:	Lands in eastern Germany - the rich farmlands of Posen and the Polish corridor between Germany and East Prussia - given to Poland.
100:	Danzig made a free city under League of Nations control.
119:	All Germany's colonies taken and given to France and Britain as 'mandates'.
160:	The German army restricted to 100,000 men.
181:	The German navy restricted to six battleships and no submarines.
198:	Germany not allowed to have an air force.
231:	Germany was responsible for causing all the loss and damage caused by the war.
232:	Germany would have to pay reparations, to be decided later - eventually set at 132 billion gold marks.

- 1. Article 232 required Germany to pay 132 billion gold marks in reparations. How much is that in USD or RMB today?
- 2. Explain how the rest of the treaty (1-231) made it harder for Germany to pay that amount.
- 3. Article 231 forced Germany to claim full responsibility for war—do you think they were responsible? Which countries started WWI?
- 4. Article 119 gave German colonies to France and Great Britain—what do you think the Treaty should have done with Germany's colonies?
- 5. Do you think the Treaty of Versailles was fair or unfair? Choose 3 articles and explain why you agree or disagree with them.
