Historical Context – At the end of the 1800s, the Chinese Qing Dynasty experienced crises both internal and external. Because it was not as slow to industrialize as other nations, it was subjected to abuse by empires with stronger weapons, leading to the opening of Chinese ports by coercion/force and the loss of territories to foreign powers

Intended Audience – The artist intended for readers from industrialized nations [represented by England (wearing rings), Germany (pointy helmet), Russia (white hat), France (woman behind Russia), and Japan (right)] to understand the plight of the Chinese (back center) and how his country is being carved up in front of him.

Point of View – The author is likely French as the original title is in French. This can also be hinted by the artist's depiction of France as the only empire (other than China) that isn't touching the cake, possibly trying to show it isn't as terrible as the other empires, but it is at the table. The artist does seem to create some racists caricatures (China's long nails, fu man chu, short height), which puts into question the author's racial biases

Purpose - Still the author seems to believe this cutting of the cake is an unfair act (as represented by the expression of China motioning a "stop" gesture) with the industrializations as aggressors.
